The Great Trail of Canada is the longest network of recreational multi-use trails in the world, linked by greenways, roadways and waterways. Whether travelling east, west, north or south, The Great Trail - created by Trans Canada Trail (TCT) and its partners - offers the natural beauty, rich history and enduring spirit of our land and its peoples.

On August 26, 2017, The Great Trail was connected from coast to coast to coast. But our journey isn't over - in fact, we're just

This involves adding new Trail sections, converting interim roadways to greenways, making the Trail more accessible and funding emergency repairs. MANITOBA

QUEBEC
